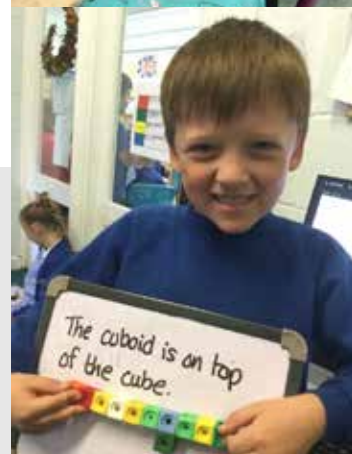

Our vibrant, happy and caring school puts children firmly at the heart of everything we do and every member of our unique school 'family' is valued and respected.

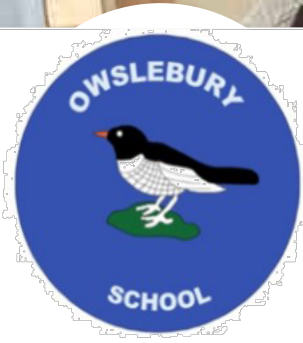

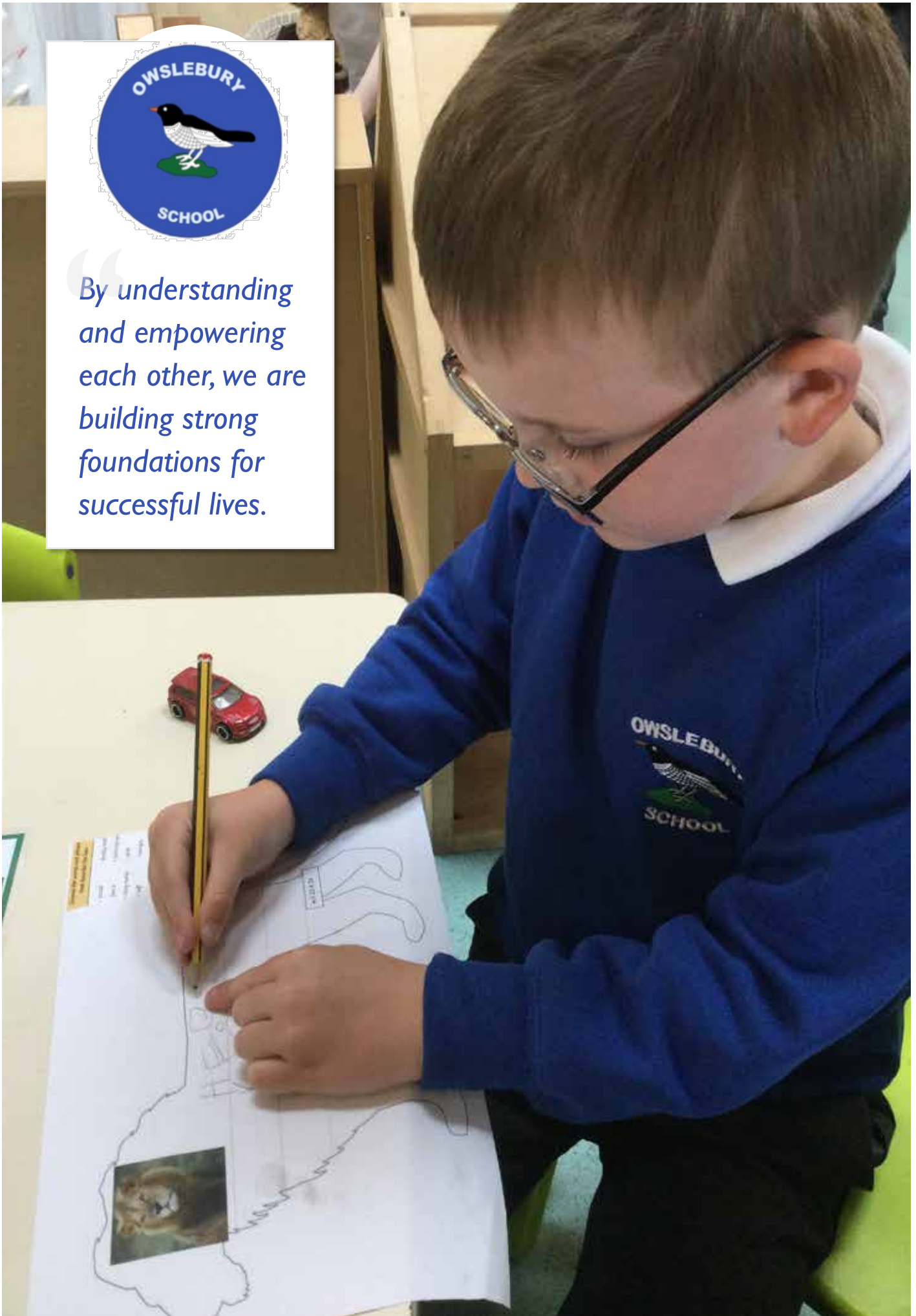

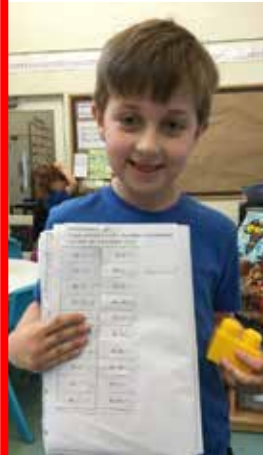

Wraparound care

At Owslebury Primary School, we understand the demands of busy family life and are pleased to offer our Breakfast and After School Club services. These clubs provide a safe, welcoming, and an enjoyable environment for children outside of regular school hours, ensuring that they are well cared for while parents manage work and other commitments.

Breakfast Club: Our Breakfast Club offers a great start to the day, ensuring that children arrive at their classrooms feeling refreshed and ready to learn. The club opens at 7:30am and runs until the start of the school day. Children are served a nutritious breakfast that includes a variety of healthy options. We focus on providing balanced meals that fuel children's energy levels and concentration throughout the morning.

Before the school day begins, children can take part in a range of quiet activities or enjoy some physical exercise in our safe play areas. These activities help to stimulate their minds and bodies, setting a positive tone for the day ahead.

After School Club: Our After School Club provides a fun and engaging environment for children to relax and enjoy themselves after the school day ends. The club operates from

3:30pm until 5:30pm offering flexible pick-up times to suit parents' schedules.

We offer a wide range of activities to cater to different interests and energy levels. Children can choose from arts and crafts, games, sports, and outdoor play. There is also time allocated for homework, allowing children to complete their assignments with support from our staff if needed.

A selection of healthy snacks is provided during the session to keep children energised and satisfied.

A Safe Environment: Our clubs are run by qualified and experienced staff who are dedicated to creating a nurturing and secure environment for all children. We maintain high standards of care and ensure that all activities are supervised appropriately.

Flexible Booking Options: We understand that flexibility is key for busy families. Our clubs offer various booking options to accommodate different needs. Bookings can be made in advance, and we strive to be as accommodating as possible.

How to apply

Thank you for considering Owslebury Primary School for your child's education. We are delighted that you are interested in joining our school community, and we look forward to guiding you through the application process. Below, you will find all the information you need to apply for a place at our school.

Visit Our School: We encourage all prospective parents and children to visit Owslebury Primary School to experience our vibrant and nurturing environment first-hand. During your visit, you will have the opportunity to tour the school, meet our dedicated staff, and ask any questions you may have.

Check Admission Criteria: Owslebury Primary School follows the admission policies set by Hampshire County Council. It is important to familiarise yourself with the admission criteria, which include factors such as catchment area, sibling attendance, and proximity to the school. Detailed information about our admission criteria can be found on our school's website.

Complete the Application Form: For children starting school in Reception, applications are made through Hampshire County Council's online application system. The application window typically opens in November and closes in January for the following September intake. To apply, please visit the Hampshire County Council website and complete the online application form within the specified timeframe.

If you are applying for a place outside the normal admission round, such as an in-year transfer, please contact the school directly to discuss availability and the application process. Our staff will guide you through the necessary steps and provide the relevant forms.

Accepting Your Place: Once you receive an offer of a place at Owslebury Primary School, you will need to accept the offer by the deadline specified in the offer

letter. This is usually done online through the Hampshire County Council website. If you decide not to accept the place, please inform both the council and the school as soon as possible, so that the place can be offered to another child.

Important Dates:

Application Deadline: Ensure your application is submitted by the deadline, usually in January, to be considered for a place in the upcoming academic year.

National Offer Day: You will be notified of the outcome of your application on National Offer Day, which typically falls in April. Offers will be communicated via email or letter from Hampshire County Council.

Appeals Process: If your application is unsuccessful, you have the right to appeal the decision. Information about the appeals process will be provided with your offer letter. Appeals are managed by Hampshire County Council and involve presenting your case to an independent panel.

Preparing for School: Once your child's place is confirmed, we will be in touch to provide you with all the necessary information to help your child transition smoothly to Owslebury Primary School. This includes details about our welcome events, induction sessions, and key dates leading up to the start of the school year.
